KIRIBATI PASSPORT

Who Can Apply:

All citizens of Kiribati – first-time applicants or renewals

 **Minors (under 18 years of age):** Require parental or guardian consent

 **Proof Required:** Identity (birth certificate and national ID and citizenship certificate only if required)

Confirmation of identity of an applicant is a requirement under Regulation 5 of the Passport Regulations 2014.

Who is authorized to confirm the identities of applicants?


Secretaries (of Government Ministries)
Member of Parliament
Mayor of a Local Council
Priest / Catechist / Pastor / Minister of Religion
Police Officer
Lawyer
Doctor
Magistrate


Passport fees and processing time:


- Priority/ Urgent (1 day) - \$112.50
- Expedited (3 days) - \$98.40
- Standard (5 days) - \$84.40
- Normal/ regular (10 days) - \$56.25


As a Passport holder, you have the responsibility to:

 **Keep your passport safe** – Protect it from loss, theft, or damage.

 **Use it lawfully** – Only for legal travel and identification purposes.

 **Provide accurate information** – Ensure all personal details on your passport are correct.

 **Renew on time** – Keep your passport valid; don't let it expire before your travel.

 **Report loss or theft immediately** – Notify the Passport Office if your passport is lost or stolen.

 **Comply with international laws** – Follow visa requirements, entry/exit rules, and local laws while abroad.



Your PASSPORT is not just a travel document, it's a legal responsibility and proof of your identity and nationality.

Lost or stolen passport? Here's what to do:

1. Report lost or stolen passports immediately to the Passport Office
2. Notify the Police and obtain a police report
3. Apply for a replacement

For lost, stolen and damaged passports, penalties apply as follows:

1st time: \$100

2nd time: \$300

Applicants who have **lost or had three (3) or more passports reported lost or stolen within a five-year period may not be issued another passport.**

What is a Certificate of Identity (COI)?

A **COI** is a travel document issued to individuals who **do not have a valid national passport but need a travel document for identification and travel purposes**. It serves as an **alternative travel document** and may be issued under special circumstances.

The Kiribati COI can only be used within the region. Travel beyond the region requires a valid passport.
